About the Role:

The Postdoctoral Associate (PDA) will support the Centre for Research & Education on Violence against Women & Children (CREVAWC), Western University, with various research projects related to gender-based harassment and violence and prevention and intervention within the world of work. The PDA will be responsible for various research and knowledge mobilization activities.

The role has a responsibility to increase research outcomes and ensure success of funded research projects by identifying and growing relationships among interdisciplinary research experts as well as national and international partners across academic, governmental, private foundations, for-profit and non-profit organizations, and unions.

The PDA will play a key role in for overall project management as well as identifying and supporting grant application processes, in collaboration with Western Research, for new major funding opportunities (locally, regionally, nationally and internationally) while supporting the development, launch and implementation of internal funding competitions.

Overall, the role is responsible for identifying and implementing ways to accelerate and increase the potential for research impact and funding of CREVAWC projects.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct and write literature reviews, develop processes and procedures for timely data collection, prepare ethics application submissions, collect and analyze data, write reports and articles for publications, and other responsibilities related to various research activities
- Prepare and present research findings at conferences and to professional groups and other researchers
- Ensure participation of internal and/or external major research funding programs calls for applications
 - Provide information regarding relevant funding programs, assists with resolving issues and, in collaboration with appropriate colleagues at Western, ensures that all submission criteria are met

- Maintain a current knowledge of relevant internal and external funding agency's policies, procedures and guidelines
- Design, plan and write aspects of grants, as well as project conceptualization, budget development and assessment of strategies for EDI
- Engage and connect interdisciplinary research experts (e.g., faculty, students, and staff) and other stakeholders (internal and external partners)
- Liaise with Western Research Teams, Faculty specific Associate Deans of Research and Research Officers and/or equivalent to support synergy and alignment
- Develop tactics and plans for increasing the number of successful grant applications, and for maximizing utilization of research programs
- Oversee the strategic alignment and implementation of special events (e.g., research components of conferences/retreats, think-tank meetings, workshops) that aim to build and nurture collaborative teams of experts
